Bettor's Delight, the top stallion in North America in terms of 2011 earnings, will be moved from New York to Ontario for the 2012 breeding season, it was announced yesterday by Blue Chip Farms. The move is pending syndicate approval.

"It's not complicated," Blue Chip owner Tom Grossman said. "We just have a lot of great Canadian customers who've always wanted to breed to this horse and race in Canada. It's a great opportunity for the horse and a chance to get a bigger book. Our stud barn in New York is quite crowded. We've added American Ideal and Rock N Roll Heaven recently. We are competing with ourselves, so it's nice to expand in this way."

Grossman said Bettor's Delight is likely to be transferred to Winbak Farm in Ontario.

"Way back when we bought Bettor's Delight, it was from Canadian ownership," Grossman said. "Everyone up there knows how good the horse is. Without commenting on anyone else's sires, I don't think there's any one comparable to Bettor's Delight in Ontario. This is a great opportunity."

Bettor's Delight's offspring have been having a terrific year on the racetrack, and their exploits include See You At Peelers' run and Breeders Crown wins by Betterthancheddar and Bettor Sweet
